Brain Injury Survivor Leaves Sprenger with Reinvigoration for Life





Eight years after a car accident threatened to take his dreams and life away, Wellington resident Kyle Delligatti is reclaiming his life with the support of his family and Sprenger Health Care Elms Retirement Village.

When a tragic car accident on February 5, 2014 caused Kyle, 25, to suffer from a traumatic brain injury which later resulted in him being in a coma for six months, nobody could have guessed that he would make it out alive but miraculously, he did. After years of obstacles and gradual recovery, Kyle was discharged from Mary Free Bed Rehabilitation

Hospital in Michigan. Knowing that his recovery journey was not over and that he would need extensive therapy services upon leaving the hospital, Kyle's family placed their trust and faith in the hands of the experienced team at Sprenger Health Care Elms Retirement Village in July 2022.

With the support of Sprenger's dedicated outpatient therapists, the love and support from Kyle's family and his very own tenacity to beat the odds, Kyle recovered by leaps and bounds and set his sights on the future.

Discharged from The Elms on August 18th, Kyle now looks forward to life as a college student, enrolling at Wright State University where he will be living on-campus and studying Political Science.

"We were delighted to aid in every way possible. Kyle has endured and maneuvered many barriers to meet his goal of going to college," said Myesha Cunningham, Sprenger Health Care Elms Retirement Village Admissions and Social Services Director. September 19-25 is National Rehabilitation Awareness Week!

- Globally, an estimated 2.4 billion people are currently living with a health condition that benefits from rehabilitation.
- Rehabilitation is not only for people with long-term or physical impairments
- The need for rehabilitation worldwide is predicted to increase due to changes in the health and characteristics of the population. For example, people are living longer, but with more chronic disease and disability.
- Currently, the need for rehabilitation is largely unmet. In some low- and middle-income countries, more than 50% of people do not receive the rehabilitation services they require. Rehabilitation services are also amongst the health services most severely disrupted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

During this week, we thank and applaud our dedicated therapists who work with our residents daily to strengthen and/or restore their mobility, minimize the effects of chronic conditions, help them set and reach their health and wellness goals, and regain/maintain their independence.
